SOPHMORES (grade 10): Please remember that all sophomores are required to attend the CAHSEE testing on: Tuesday, March 18, English-Language Arts, 9-12:30 and Wednesday, March 19, Math, 9-12:30. Please be at school by 8:45 so that testing can begin on time.

JUNIORS/SENIORS: If you have not passed the CAHSEE, please plan to attend these testing dates as well. While the CAHSEE is not a timed test, it must be completed within the official school day. Most students are able to complete the test in about three hours. No parents will be admitted to the school site, teachers will not be meeting with students in their offices, and classes will be cancelled for those two days.



College Courses

Many PCHS students take community college courses to augment their high school transcripts. If you are interested in taking college classes, follow these procedures:

- Decide on a course
- Obtain the necessary forms from the college website or catalog. Please note that there is paperwork specific to high school students.
- Complete your potion of the paperwork. Indicate whether you are taking the course for high school or college credits.
- Machele Kilgore must approve the class and sign the paperwork. Call to see when she will be on campus to complete this
- Bring in the completed paperwork and a copy of the college catalog course description.
- Take the paperwork to the college to complete the registration process.

FAFSA



Graduates planning on attending a California College or University should complete: the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

The FAFSA should be filed as soon after January 1st. online at www.fafsa.gov. Students and parents provide the best estimate of their income as possible, then later, log back into the website to add the actual figures.

All FAFSA questions are on the "FAFSA on the Web" worksheet. The worksheet can be completed before sitting down to file the FAFSA. http://www.college-financial-aid-advice.com/fafsa-official-website.html#worksheet.

The Deadline for California FAFSA and Cal Grant students is March 3, 2014.

Any Graduate planning on attending a California College or University should also file for the Cal Grant.

First, students should provide Kathy Fusaro at PCHS with their Social Security Number. Kathy files your Cal Grant GPA electronically to the state which matches your SS# to your FAF-SA filing
