

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

Cal Grant Competition

Graduates who will be attending a Community College in the fall.

Students eligible to participate in the 2014 September Cal Grant Competition: Community College students who did not receive a Cal Grant award offer for the March 2, 2014 application process may still receive consideration for the 2014-15 September 2 award competition. Students who did not apply for the March 2 award competition must:

- Complete a 2014-15 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov no later than September 2, 2014.
- Ensure that their verified grade point average (GPA) is submitted to the Commission for the 2014-15 Cal Grant application period by September 2nd.

If you have submitted your social security number to PCHS, your GPA has already been submitted.

- Have your Social Security number listed on a California Community College fall enrollment.
- Enroll in and attend a California Community College for the 2014 fall term.



Planning for College

It's important for students to make educated decisions about where to apply to college and college visits play a definite role in that process. Here are five ways to trim the costs of those visits.

Stay local. "Do I want a large or small, urban or rural school?" If that's the case, do your exploring close to home.

<u>Cut the numbers</u>. Use the internet, school counselors and college fairs to narrow the list of prospective schools. Wait till spring when acceptances arrive, and visit two or three. **a.** It's important to visit certain types of schools before applying. If you're a Californian and applying to the University of Maine or Michigan, you need to go see it in January.

b. Music and theatre majors need to meet with faculty.

c. Small, private schools see campus visits as an indication of your child's level of interest in them. <u>Find hotel discounts</u>. Ask the hotel manager about college discounts when you book a room.

Split costs. Split travel expenses by bringing along friends who are interested in the same schools.

Some families also build college visits into their vacation plans. Live on Campus. Many colleges offer an overnight program for prospective students. Even if you do not stay on campus, you'll want to eat on campus. It's cheaper than restaurants in town and it gives you a chance to interact with the real campus experts - other students. Book a tour. Set up a tour with campus personnel before you visit.

Here are some frequently asked questions regarding registration for Fall or July-August:

• I did not receive my registration letter. What do I do?

Contact Sandi Curtis as soon as possible.

- If I do not complete fall registration, will I be enrolled at PCHS for the fall?
 No. PCHS is an independent study high school and is required to have a written and signed registration for each trimester. Students who do not complete registration are withdrawn on June 6, 2014.
- I am not sure if I will be returning to PCHS in the fall. What should I do? Can I attend the July-August program even if I will not be attending in the fall? Contact Sandi Curtis regarding fall registration. Yes, students may attend July-August program without attending in the fall.
- Can I just register over the phone or fax in my registration paperwork? No, Independent Study Law requires written agreements with original signatures; no faxing allowed.

• I turned in my fall registration. I have now decided I would like to enroll in a July-August class. Is it too late?

July/August and Fall Registration Questions & Answers

No, it is not too late. We will be accepting July-August program enrollment up until 5/30/14 pending class availability.

 I turned in my fall registra tion, but would now like to change a course I enrolled in for fall. What should I do?

If you wish to change something on your fall schedule, please contact your faculty advisor before June 6, 2014. After that date, all changes to fall courses will be made on August 25 and 26, 2014.

 I turned in my registration for the July-August program, but would like to change the course(s) I listed. What should I do? Contact your faculty advisor before June 6, 2014 and after that date complete a July-August Add/Drop form available on our website, July-August webpage. We will accept Add/Drop forms until June 30, 2014. • I signed up for fall registration at PCHS, but my plans have changed. What should I do?

 When will we have access to syllabi, books, online instructions, and passwords for the July-August program?

All courses are online. All syllabi will be made available online as of 7/01/14 to those students who have completed registration. Books are not required.

• When do we pick up syllabi, books, online passwords and final student schedules for fall? You may pick up student schedules, all hybrid course syllabi & books, purchase yearbooks, have student pictures taken and purchase student ID cards 8/25 and 8/26/14.
